

DIRECTIONS

1. Click on the first link to visit the Zoom Butterfly site. Always click on the back button to get back to the first page of Zoom Butterfly. This is the Table of Contents page and it will tell you where to look for answers.
 - a. At this site scroll down near the bottom of the page to find the words BUTTERFLY QUIZZES TO PRINT.
 - b. Print out the 1st set of questions for grades 2-3. These questions will guide you in your search about the life of a butterfly.
 - c. Scroll down the page slowly and read the words in the Table of Contents. These words will tell you where to look for your answers. Notice that the site is divided into topics. Click on ANATOMY to find out about the butterfly's body. Click on LIFE CYCLE to find out about the butterfly's stages of life or metamorphosis. Click on ALL ABOUT BUTTERFLIES to answer other questions. Be sure to answer all the questions, read carefully, and write other interesting facts on the back of your printout.
 - d. Before you leave Zoom Butterfly scroll down to the bottom of the home page and click on Interactive Butterfly Puzzle. Answer the questions to see how much you have learned at this site.
2. Click on the Children's Butterfly Site link.
 - a. Click on the words FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS.
 - b. Read some of the questions and click on at least 3 that you would like to know and read the answers. (Be sure to use your back button to get back to the questions each time.)
 - c. Now write at least 3 interesting facts about butterflies that you learned at this site on the back of your printout.
3. Click on the link Kid Stuff.
 - a. Play at least one of the games there.
 - b. Before you leave the site click on COLORING BOOK and print out one butterfly picture to color to illustrate your report.
4. Now use your notes to write a 3 paragraph report about butterflies.
 - a. In the first paragraph tell about what kind of animal it is and describe its body.
 - b. In the second paragraph tell about metamorphosis and describe the stages of a butterfly's life.
 - c. In the third paragraph list at least 3 more interesting facts that you have learned about butterflies.
5. Color your butterfly printout and attach it to your report. You may work with your partner to do your report but each of you should write your own report.
